

Summer Scholars: Frequently Asked Questions

Who can participate in Summer Scholars?

- Ohio students from entering freshman through graduating seniors with a 2.75 cumulative GPA.

What other costs are associated with the program?

- Tuition is free, but books and other fees including, but not limited to, lab fees, technology fees, and institutional fees are the responsibility of the student.

How much will this cost?

- Costs vary depending on which classes you take. Please see our sample schedule for more information.

How do I apply?

- If you are not already accepted, submit an application for admission for the summer term, along with high school transcripts.
- If you were a summer scholar last year, please apply and submit transcripts again.

What if I'm already accepted for Fall 2010?

- You need to submit transcripts showing 2.75 GPA then pick up a tuition waiver from Rio admissions.

What other forms do I need?

- Pick up a tuition waiver from the admissions office (located in the Rhodes Student Center). ***You must turn in this waiver form to the community college office.***

What happens if I don't turn in my tuition waiver?

- You will be billed for the full tuition amount, so this is VERY important!

When can I register?

- Once you complete your forms in admissions, as well as any required testing, you are ready to register.

Which classes can I take?

- You may take any 100-200 level course, as long as pre-requisites are met and space allows.
- Those who would like to take English or math courses **must** take the COMPASS Placement test. This test can be taken any time; however, we recommend taking it as soon as possible. Contact the New Student Advising Office: (740) 245-7279 or 1-800-282-7201 ext. 7279 to schedule.

How many hours am I allowed?

- You may take up to 12 hours total for the summer.

Do any of Rio's summer classes count as high school credit?

- No, summer scholars is not a dual enrollment program.

What if I'm planning a vacation during the summer?

- Plan your schedule during a session when you will not have to miss classes. Take summer fairs/festivals into account.
