Florence Allen Scholarship Program

The Florence Allen Scholarship program was established in 1924 to honor Judge Florence Ellinwood Allen, Ohio's first woman Supreme Court justice. Since its conversion to a tax exempt Endowment Fund in 1988, more than \$67,000 in scholarships has been awarded to help Ohio women achieve their full potential through education. Scholarship funds are for the 2010-11 academic year and may be used for courses at accredited degree-granting institutions recognized by a state Board of Regents.

Eligibility for Florence Allen Scholarships is as follows:

Traditional Student Applicants

1. Women who will graduate or have graduated from an Ohio high school or who have received a GED from the Ohio Board of Education prior to July 1, 2010.
2. Must be a United States citizen.
3. Undergraduates who meet the above criteria and are enrolled as full-time students at an accredited degree-granting institution recognized by a state Board of Regents.

Non-traditional Student Applicants

1. Women who are residents of Ohio and are at least 30 years old as of April 1, 2010.
2. Must be a United States citizen.
3. Undergraduates who meet the above criteria and are enrolled at an accredited degree-granting institution recognized by a state Board of Regents.

NOTE: Applicant need not be a full-time student.

Deadline:

The completed application and all supporting documentation must be hand-stamped (not metered) and postmarked on or before March 1, 2010.
