Celebrating International Women's Day: Beryl Halley, Written by Jacob L. Bapst and Ivan M. Tribe

Today the name of Beryl Halley is largely forgotten. But in the decade remembered as the "Roaring Twenties," she made a name for herself. Best known for three seasons as a "Ziegfeld Girl."

Nannie (later changed to Nina) Beryl Halley was born in the tiny Ohio River hamlet of Bladen, Ohio on June 20, 1897, the middle child of Samuel and Melissa Porter Halley. She had an older sister Cecile and a younger brother.

Educational opportunities were limited in Gallia County, and the parents aspired for their children to get as much schooling as possible. As a result, the parents took charge of the Boarding Hall at Rio Grande College in the summer of 1909, a position they held until 1912. By that time, both Cecile and Beryl were firmly ensconced into the "Rio community" from whence both girls were graduated from the High School and Cecile obtained a bachelor's degree in 1917.
