The Ohio Water Environment Association (OWEA) was formed to encourage the improvement of water quality and waste treatment techniques. Communication and application of appropriate technology are major goals of this Association. The WATER ENVIRONMENT SCIENCE AWARD is sponsored by the OWEA to encourage Ohio's youth to become involved in protecting the environment and improving stream water quality through science and technology. The award is presented at the Ohio Academy of Sciences District and State Fairs.

AWARDS

Knowledge and personal growth are the principal rewards of a Science Fair project. The SEOWEA honors District - Water Environment Science Award winners with a certificate and a \$100 check.

CRITERIA

All Science Day projects devoted to water quality, water reclamation, or wastewater treatment are eligible for consideration for the WATER ENVIRONMENT SCIENCE AWARD. A superior project should be carefully designed and scientifically conducted. Projects should be creative, demonstrate proper use of scientific method, and incorporate accurate information and appropriate technology. Examples of winning projects are: Stream Water Quality, Purifying Mine Drainage, The Colors of Water, Water Pollution, Industrial Waste in Streams, Wastewater Treatment by Biological Processes, Phosphorus Treatment/Removal, Ammonia Treatment/Removal, Agricultural Runoff Pollutants and Sludge Treatment and Utilization.
